Over the past several weeks, Congress has taken the legislation proposed by the Administration regarding systemic risk and financial regulatory agency reform and put its own spin on the subjects. Debate on the proposed legislation continues. The Senate and House bills differ significantly from each other. Within each house, the parties are far apart on how to resolve certain important issues. In addition, regulatory agencies are pressing to retain or expand their current jurisdiction. In this roundtable, our panelists will explain how the Administration's proposal and the House and Senate bills compare and discuss chances and timing for passage. Among the areas we will cover are:

- How the bills address systemic risk regulation (including resolution authority)
- How the bills propose to reorganize bank supervision among regulatory agencies
- How the bills propose to consolidate consumer protection regulatory authority in one agency
- Which regulators and industries will win and lose under these proposals, and why
- The current status of the bills; who are the movers and shakers in getting them to their respective floors for a vote; and what *really* has been going on behind the scenes
